Class 2 Autumn News Letter

Welcome back! We hope you've had a fantastic summer break. Year 1 and 2 are extremely fun and busy years. Year 1 children will be sitting the National Phonics test in June and Year 2 children will be completing National SATs tests in May. If you have any queries or concerns, please don't hesitate to get in touch. We are excited to get started on what we hope will be a fantastic year full of learning!

Important days in your child's week:

Monday	P.E. on an afternoon
Friday	Spelling Test in the morning P.E on an afternoon

Things to note:

- Tuck shop is 20p a day. Please send the correct money or a £1 coin for the week, but no more than this!
- Please make sure your child brings their reading folder to school every day. We will be reading with children when ever possible. It also means we can check each day if your child's book needs changing.
- Please make sure that your child brings their bags into school

everyday incase there are letters or other important information your child needs to take home as children without their bags do struggle with carrying things out at the end of the school day.

- The school now provides P. E. Kits to the children, this means you do not have to send your child to school with a P.E kit. However we do not provide plimsolls/trainers, so it would be great if you sent some in for your child to keep on their peg this year.
- Please make sure that you write your name into your child's school clothes, this helps us so much when they are left around school to give them back to the correct child.

Literacy

Throughout your child's time in Class 2, we will cover a range of text types/ genres of writing, including: stories, recounts, non-chronological reports and poems. We will also focus on developing your child's understanding of English grammar, punctuation and spelling to support the children as they prepare for their Year 2 SATs. Our class will continue to have weekly spellings to practise at home, which will be tested on Fridays.

Each child will be given a reading book to read at home each night and then read to an adult in school. In guided reading we will be concentrating on improving our understanding of a range of different genres, by reading a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts and answering questions on topics such as: the author's use of language, text structure and authors' viewpoints. Year 2 children will be signed up to Accelerator Reader, your child will take a test which then tells us which level they are at, children will then read the book and then take a quiz. Year 1 children will still be doing a phonics lesson preparing them for their phonics test in June.

Maths

During Year 1 and 2 we spend a lot of time learning the basics. This includes mental recall of facts such as times tables and their corresponding division facts, doubles and halves and number bonds. In addition to this, we will also

be covering topics such as place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, shape, position, time and measurement.

Our Topics

The year is split into 3 terms. This term our topic is 'Me and my School'. In history, we will be looking at how school life has changed. In Geography we will be learning about hot and cold places and looking at how weather changes, and in Design and Technology and Art where we will be looking at structures and our self-portraits. In science we will be investigating different materials.

Homework

It is expected that your child will read at home, at least 3 times a week. This must be recorded in their reading log book. Your child will then receive a reading dojo every morning if they have read at home. Please don't underestimate the importance of regular reading practice at home. Every morning, your child will be asked to put their reading book in the reading book tray. We will then check the book and change it if we feel your child is ready and has understood the book they've read.

Your child will have a weekly spelling test, which will take place on a Friday morning. You will receive the spellings for the term and it will state which spelling are for what week. To achieve expected level for Year 1 and Year 2 writing, children have to be able to apply the spelling rules from their years group's spelling lists, so please do practise the spellings as much as possible!
