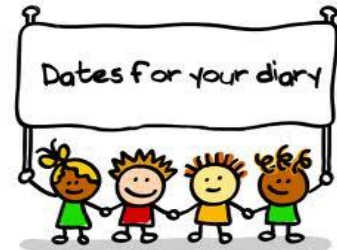
NEU strike action
